Portfolios Defence / Digitising Government

On 12 May 2025, Cabinet:

- authorised the absence of Hon Judith Collins KC from New Zealand, from 28 May to 2 June 2025, to travel to Singapore for the Asia Tech Summit and Shangri-La Dialogue;
- agreed that she be accompanied by two members of staff from her office, one of whose costs will be met by the Ministry of Defence;
- approved the estimated expenditure of up to \$25,842.60 for the travel expenses of the Ministerial party as a charge to Vote Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive Travel);
- 4 **noted** that she will be accompanied by a delegation from the Department of Internal Affairs, Ministry of Defence and the New Zealand Defence Force, whose costs will be met by their agencies;
- 5 **agreed** that in her absence:
 - 5.1 Hon Paul Goldsmith act as Attorney-General, Minister Responsible for the GSCB and Minister Responsible for the NZSIS;
 - 5.2 Hon Chris Penk act as Minister of Defence;
 - 5.3 Hon James Meager act as Minister for Digitising Government and Minister for the Public Service;

- 1 I seek Cabinet approval to travel to Singapore from 28 May to 02 June under my Defence and Digitising Government portfolios.

Purpose of Travel

Asia Tech Summit

- I plan to attend the Asia Tech Summit as Minister for Digitising Government. I attended this event last year and it was a valuable opportunity to hear more about what partners are doing with AI technology, governance, safety and government digitisation.
- I see immense value in participating in this programme again this year and will seek calls on my counterparts to further learn more about what their governments are doing in this space.

Shangri-La Dialogue

- Hosted annually by the International Institute for Strategic Studies, last year's Shangri-La Dialogue brought together four Heads of State and 32 Defence Ministers, including, but not limited to, my counterparts s6(a)

 This year I intend on seeking bilateral meetings with key partners and will speak at a plenary session s9(2)(g)(i)
- 6 Last year's dialogue was an immensely valuable insight into our security partners' regional perspectives, especially during this time of heightened geopolitical tensions. Now more than ever, it is important for New Zealand to be present and engaged in regional dialogue and discussion so we can continue to have a role in Indo-Pacific security.

Report on Overseas Travel: Hon Judith Collins KC

I recommend that Cabinet note this report on my travel from 28 May – 2 June 2025 to Singapore under my Defence and Digitising Government portfolios.

Report

Asia Tech Summit

- On 29 May, I attended the AsiaXTech Summit. As part of this programme, I took the time to meet with my counterparts from Ireland, India and Singapore to discuss common challenges and the need to drive progress in digitising government.
- I also visited GovTech, where the team provided a practical demonstration of Singapore's successful digitisation strategy. I took the opportunity to share the progress New Zealand has made with the NZ Verify app and work underway on an All of Government App.

Shangri-La Dialogue

- Hosted annually by the International Institute of Strategic Studies (IISS), the Shangri-La Dialogue is the premier Indo-Pacific security summit, bringing defence ministers and heads of state from across the region.
- On the sidelines of the formal IISS programme, I held 15 bilateral meetings with a range of counterparts and groupings including Australia, Chile, Papua New Guinea, Japan, Singapore, Viet Nam, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Ukraine, the United Kingdom, ministerial counterparts from the Five Power Defence Arrangement, the Secretary General of the Pacific Island Forum, and a US Congressional Delegation.

s9(2)(g)(i)

As part of the Shangri-La programme, I spoke on a panel with my counterparts from Finland and France titled *Cyber, Undersea & Outer-Space Defence Challenges*. This was a valuable opportunity to reaffirm New Zealand's commitment to collective security across a wide range of domains. I was also able to discuss our successful space sector, and that New Zealand had the third-highest number of launches last year.
